Happy New Year,

I trust the holidays have been good to you and it is now time to face yet another new year. I can't believe 2011 is gone and it seems like only a few days since the last New Year's. When I remember back to those 100 degree days we were having, I guess it has been a little while.

I am extremely happy to report that as of December the 12th, the Club's Line of Credit was paid off and the current balance is \$0. That is the first time in several years that it has been zero. We were dealt some severe calamities, one after the other, and then topped off with a severe economic downturn that had the LOC almost maxed out in February of this year. The Board made some very difficult decisions that we were not all that happy about ourselves, but the alternatives were much less attractive. Through the first eleven months of this year, we have a \$123,534 profit compared to a \$208,093 loss last year, at the same time. That came about due to many things, Tim's excellent cost controls and a very aggressive membership drive being the two largest factors. We can now start planning for the future rather than paying off the past. Thank you for your support.

Typically I cringe a little when I see someone heading to my table. I'm still a little gun shy after all the issues we had with food prior to Chef Mike joining our team. This month it has been amazing how many comments I have received about the outstanding food. I could not agree more. I hesitate to mention my current favorite, the Prime Rib. Last time I mentioned a dish it sold out and I couldn't get it for a couple of weeks. By the time you get this, the Club will be closing for the annual maintenance shutdown so hopefully Chef Mike can be stocked up when the Club reopens the middle of January. I will be happy to wait in the event it sells out, it's worth it.

Thank you to those members who held their Christmas parties at the Club. Your support of your Club is very much appreciated and needed. If you are not holding your party at the Club, please contact Tim or Anthony about reserving a date for next year.

The election of new board members will be held on January 24th with the polling table open from 12 noon until 7 pm. The Annual Membership Meeting will be held at 7:30pm once the ballots are counted. The four outstanding candidates are: Jeff Holland, Chris Hunkler, Tommy Owen and Richard Trampe. Please come out to vote and attend the annual meeting.

In the New Year's tradition of "out with old and in with the new", I will be leaving as President and David Denton will be taking over at the end of January. I'm not really sure how David can be called "new", but oh well. As Finance Chairman he has had a constant eye on our finances and is another reason for our turnaround. I'm not saying goodbye yet as you have one more month to put up with me. After that, I get to rejoin the ranks of "what are those moron Board members doing to us now". I have learned one thing that I promise future Boards, I will never criticize a decision until I at least ask the question of "why did you decide to do that". Many times the membership is not aware of what the Board is facing, so their resulting decisions may not make sense on the surface. I am proud to say that in my four years on the Board, each and every member I have served with, was there to lookout for the Club's best interest.

As always, we want to hear what you think. After all, it is YOUR Club.

For those that 'fly south for the winter' or are out of the Paducah area for a **full billing cycle** for a period up to six months you may apply for the "Snowbird Waiver".

This provision allows you to get credit for any food & beverage minimum you were charged while out of town. Your unused minimum will continue to be charged on your statement during the month(s) you are away, however, you can receive credit for this depending on how much you spend during the month(s) you return. For example, if you are out of town for the month of March, you will still see the F&B minimum charge of \$80 on your statement, but if you spend at least \$160 during the month of April, this satisfies your April minimum requirement as well as March, therefore you will receive a credit for what was charged while your were out of town. You must complete and turn in the snowbird waiver prior to leaving town.

Call the office if you wish to apply for the Snowbird Waiver or have questions.

- * Please return statement stub with payment to assure proper credit.

Golf Course News

Happy New Year! Good bye 2011. I have expressed that same sentiment each of the last two years as relief from the weather we had experienced during the year and I have to say it again. Early in December the old record for rainfall for the year was surpassed and with half of December to go as I write, who knows how much higher the new record will be. More and more people are predicting another cold and wet winter season that could contain up to two feet of snow and several ice storms. The best prediction I have heard was that there looks to be abundant moisture this winter but how it will come to the earth is too hard to know with any certainty until the event happens.

The rainfall in November and December grounded many of our planned projects on the course. The ground is so wet and without adequate day length and sunlight, does not dry up. Hopes were high that leftover stumps could be ground and tree trimming would be well under way. Neither will take place in the foreseeable fu-

ture. Maybe we will catch a weather break the next two months and get it done. The last topdressing and fertilization of greens also hangs in the balance. There is a slight chance it will be accomplished the week before Christmas but there are no guarantees.

Each off season, the goal is to examine the whole operation and see what needs to be changed and tweaked to make it better. Better can be less expensive, new ideas or even more expensive if it results in achieving satisfaction for the membership. During December our goal has been to organize our building to accommodate new equipment and push us closer to "everything has a place and everything is in its place." This is done to help give staff a sense of ownership and pride in their workplace and also a responsibility to keep it tidy.

Programs for the course are always being evaluated. Last year the intermediate rough had to be reinstalled to accommodate golfers' concerns. With the new rough mowers set low-

er, it will again be eliminated. The challenge this winter is to insure enough staff and hours are available to mow the rough twice per week. Along that same line, schedules will be shifted to allow more man-hours to be used trimming around bunkers and lakes and raking bunkers.

Of course this is the time of year that all equipment is maintained and the accessories are cleaned and renewed. If January's weather is nice, we hope to do some tree trimming to allow the new mowers easy access. If the weather forecasters are correct, we might spend a good portion of time keeping the clubhouse parking lot clean. Either way, stay warm and we hope to see you on nice days.
