GREEN SCENE

Shannon Watson, CGC Superintendent

The month of July was challenging to say the least. Everyday had a new set of challenges. Whether it was heat, humidity, equipment malfunctions, or several irrigation leaks the Thursday and Friday before Member/Member, we kept finding a way. The temperatures the last two weeks of the month were consistently in the 90's, with oppressive humidity. The month also brought some pop-up thunderstorms that caused some flooding and some softer conditions on the greens. When the humidity is this high, it is hard to get evaporation of excess moisture out of the rootzone. We must rely on the turf to accomplish this thru a process called transpiration. Tiny holes in the turf leaf allows water to leave the plant. The transpiration process in plants is the equivalent to us breathing during exercise. So, when we workout and are breathing hard from the stress we put on our bodies is no different than the bentgrass turf on the greens transpiring in the stresses of summer. So begins the dog days of August. Typically, July and August are the most challenging months for turf managers. August can be brutal on living plants because of the repetitive days of heat and humidity causing immense physiological stresses. Our focus will remain on greens first, as we adapt to biotic and abiotic stresses that change daily during these summer months.

The greens did well over the course of July. We were able to produce some excellent putting conditions even with the weather being so hot. Fairway aerification should be completed or close to completion by now. With the temperatures being so high, an abundance of July rainfall, a shortage of aerification tines due to Covid, and our greens first philosophy, we used a 5/8" solid tine that we

were able to work at a 4 to 4.5-inch depth. We adjusted the speed of the tractor to go slower to insure we made the most holes possible. The whole process had a very minimal disruption to play or playability. The solid tinning approach to fairway aerification was recommended to us to limit the spread of bermudagrass in our fairways. This spreading is unavoidable during the processing of cores, because of the encroachment of bermudagrass in the areas that were sprigged and not sodded during the fairway renovation. We started counting cooling degree days to additionally spray the bermudagrass in our fairways on August 1st. Once the total accumulates to 10CDD, we will apply two herbicides that affect the bermudagrass. The cooling degree day method for bermudagrass control is university tested to be the time when bermudagrasses are the most susceptible to the herbicides before winter dormancy. On a positive note, as the rain began to fall over the course of July, I was amazed at how quick we were able to return carts to the fairways after these heavy rain events. Rooting in the fairways is also better than it has been over the past several years. We will apply a calcium application to these surfaces in the next couple weeks that will further help the turf, soil structure, and rooting.

In closing, we will be staying busy with a few projects over the next month. The drainage being installed by Green Tee Golf, is a welcome addition and will help protect the new surfaces on the cart paths when they are repaved. This drainage will also serve as exit points in the future when we add additional fairway drainage. We will be venting greens again this month, controlling weeds, eliminating more trees, and cutting a lot of grass as the Bermuda and Zoysia are in the prime of their growing season. Also, we will be core aerating the greens, weather pending, at the end of the month.




