As the first quarter of 2022 comes to an end, I was fortunate to attend the 2022 CMAA (Club Management Association of America) Trade Show in San Diego. To say I returned to Paducah refreshed would be an understatement, and I am eager to incorporate some of the lessons learned and new ideas shared into your member experience in the short-term and beyond. This annual educational opportunity brings together nearly 2,000 Private Club Professionals from all over the world, and it was great to connect with both old friends and new colleagues alike during my visit.

I sometimes field the question about the findings of our 2021 Comprehensive Member Survey and know the team has been focusing on your valued feedback. One member amenity mentioned often was the Pool, and I am pleased to inform you that in conjunction with the House Committee, that some much-needed upgrades are planned for the upcoming season. We plan to provide further shade offerings, as well as enhancing the number of tables around the Pool. Lastly, we will be firming up service logistics and ways to enhance your Food & Beverage dining experience as you spend the summer heat with us often.

As many of you know, the Club was impacted in November 2021 by a surge that resulted in the loss of our main Audio-Visual Operating tower. This unfortunate turn of events, paired with the lack of available technology parts, is still unresolved. I am happy to report that some of the components required to operate the system have arrived, yet the primary component instrumental to the success of all pieces working collaboratively is still on backorder. I am unsure of the exact timeline, but know we are working diligently to get this issue resolved.

Upon reopening in January, I heard rave reviews about our new menu launch and next Tuesday, March 8, the culinary team will be back at it again as they bring to you a "refreshed" early spring menu launch. We have been incorporating changes more frequently and Chef Joel is focused on providing your palates with ever-changing flavors to savor. Although the procurement of goods has proven to be a challenge, we have added a few additional purveyors to the mix to bring the highest quality ingredients into your Club.

OFF THE TEE

It is hard to describe how much the supply chain issues have affected the golf industry, but I do want to give you a quick glimpse into the void. We hosted a highly successful fitting event in October of 2021 and the majority of iron orders from that day have either just arrived or are scheduled to arrive in mid-March. One of my fitting cart providers just sent me an email saying to pull 8 different shaft models that are currently out of stock, and they do not expect stock to return anytime in the near future. I write of all these delays just to show where our industry currently stands. BUT, the positive side of this is that there is a log of outstanding equipment coming out this year. I never try to be the pushy salesperson, but if you plan to upgrade any of your equipment this year, I recommend getting the order in with us as soon as possible. Currently orders that are placed for new product are looking at a 6-to-8-week window to ship, and most vendors are saying they expect this to get worse as the season moves forward. If you have any questions about product or if this is the right year for you to get fit, please reach out and I will be happy to assist.

Lastly, I would like to invite all our members to take advantage of the member pricing in your Golf Shop. As many of you may or may not know, the club owns the Golf Shop and we can provide our members with outstanding pricing. Also, if your business is looking to purchase corporate apparel or golf balls, I would appreciate the chance to show you the pricing structure that is available for our members corporate needs.

GREEN SCENE

The Golf Industry Show in San Diego was very informative. I took a couple of seminars and learned some valuable information regarding herbicide usage and new chemistries to help combat herbicide resistance in turf. Herbicide resistance in turf is a hot topic now because there are several documented cases around the country where herbicides can become ineffective on a property. The plant resistance to the herbicide occurs with repeated use of the same product over and over to take care of weed populations. An example of documented resistance is Glyphosate (Round Up) resistant Poa annua. The seminar also talked about newer chemistries of herbicides that can be used instead of roundup to take care of Poa contamination in warm season turfgrasses. This information will prove important to our situation this Spring if precipitation in the purchase area does not moderate. Labor and supply chain shortages were the most common topics talked about during the week. Equipment manufacturers biggest challenge is availability of materials to produce machinery and parts for seasonal maintenance. I was told that if we bought a new piece of equipment now, that unit would not arrive to property until the summer of 2023. Planning for equipment replacement will now require more strategic planning. Production hold ups have been caused by lack of chip availability, certain types of bed knives are tough to get, resins to make parts have been in short supply, and tires/wheels have been a struggle to source. This is compounded with the most open orders equipment manufacturers have ever had, with the demand for equipment being unprecedented. Inflationary pressures on materials and components are at a 50 year high, so there is no guarantee on price when your equipment finally arrives. Around the country it is becoming harder and harder to find people willing to perform manual labor on a golf course. I heard many strategies that Clubs are implementing to attract potential employees and keep them working throughout the season. I plan to implement some of these strategies this coming year. The recent technology that is coming into the industry is amazing! Because of the lack of labor worldwide on golf courses, the technological advances in drone mowers is coming along fast.

On the course, we have been working when the rain will allow. We have done a fair amount of pruning and will have to burn the pile at the shop soon. Our round up and preemergent applications have been put on hold with the amount of rain received in February. We currently have treated 15 acres. If we are unable to finish the dormant round up spray in the fairways, we will use a different product that

will not injure the warm season turf if winter dormancy has been broken. We have been pruning, relocating sod, applying spring plant protectants and preemergence. In the shop, we are winding down our winter equipment maintenance with only a couple more units to work on. We have been waiting on the parts for around 4 weeks. Debra has planned out Spring plantings and a refreshment to several landscape beds around the course. Spring cleanup has begun on the course as well. Reece Streufert is on property working as our new First Assistant Superintendent. He spent the last few weeks getting acclimated with the operation and has hit the ground running. Scott Foreman retired on the 21st and will take a month off before returning to mow during the season.

This month, we look forward to warmer temperatures and not having to shovel snow. The warmer weather in March allows us to start maintaining bunkers, mowing the greens on a regular basis, changing holes more frequently, and applying pre- and post-emergent herbicides for weeds. The plant protectant program will start on the greens, as well as our topdressing program. We will soon begin cutting the young turf on the short game green. The turf under the cover is doing well (as seen below) and once freezing temperatures and winter precipitation subside, the growth cover will come off.



We will also complete our annual spring greens aerification on March 14th and 15th. The aerification process sets the tone for the green surfaces over the golf season. We hope to start bringing back staff over the first couple weeks of the month and hit the ground running. Additionally, we will be continuing to work on the pruning of trees and some drainage improvements. March, as always, is a busy month on the course, and we hope the weather cooperates to help us build momentum for the Spring golfing season.

IN THE KITCHEN

As March approaches, it also marks four months of service that I have been here in Paducah as your Interim Executive Chef. It has been quite the journey to date, and I am pleased with the direction of the culinary program. The team has bought in to my leadership and as a unit, we are making strides for the better. With Saint Patrick's Day fast approaching, I wanted to share one of my recipe gems that will bring out the blarney in everyone! I encourage you to try: **Stout & Honey Beef Roast** (12 servings).

Ingredients

- 12 small red potatoes (about 1-1/2 pounds), scrubbed
- 6 to 7 medium carrots (about 1 pound), peeled and cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 2 medium onions, quartered
- 1 boneless beef chuck roast (4 pounds), trimmed
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) beef broth
- 1 cup beer or additional beef broth
- 1/2 cup honey
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 teaspoon dried marjoram

- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1/4 cup cold water
- Minced fresh thyme, optional

Directions

Place potatoes, carrots, and onion in a 5-qt. slow cooker. Cut roast in half; transfer to slow cooker. In a small bowl, combine next 9 ingredients; pour over top. Cook, covered, on low until meat and vegetables are tender, 8-10 hours.

Slice beef and keep warm. Strain cooking juices, reserving vegetables and 1 cup liquid. Skim fat from reserved liquid; transfer liquid to a small saucepan. Bring to a boil. Combine cornstarch and water until smooth; gradually stir into juices. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, about 2 minutes. Serve with beef and vegetables. If desired, top with fresh thyme.
