Just a quick reminder that we do have ball mark repair canes stationed at the SGA, if you finish your practice and want to help out, please feel free to use these tools.

I'd like to throw out a huge THANK YOU to Shannon Watson and his turf care staff! We have been through an unbelievable rain shortage, and it is frankly amazing how they have kept our bent grass greens and our facility in such excellent condition. High heat and no rain are certainly a recipe for disaster in the turf world and they have definitely stepped up to the plate. Please take the time to offer them your thanks when you see the turf care team on the course.

With the golf course experiencing its first stages of winter dormancy, I would like to take this opportunity to address some important steps in general course maintenance and etiquette to help keep CCP looking beautiful throughout the upcoming months. First, let me remind everyone of the importance of filling in the fairway divots with sand. The zoysia grass growth and healing season is slowing, and every unfilled divot will soon begin to show. The second issue is to ensure that everyone continues to repair all of their ball marks.

Lastly, I would like to encourage our members to come out and play in RTJ's Revenge on Saturday, October 29th. This three-person scramble will be unlike any other time you have played CCP (other than the previous 5 events). With our new black tee boxes this tough day challenge will be something to experience.

## Green Scene

Fall has arrived early in Western Kentucky, and we hope that you have been taking advantage of the weather and enjoying the course. The temperatures have been October-like since the last part of September, and these temperatures have been welcomed by the turf staff. The warm season turfs have started to slow in growth, and we have been able to finally get the rough under control. Precipitation has been lacking over the past few months and we seem to be entering severe drought conditions. The irrigation system has not received much of a break over the past four months. Several more trees have taken a toll from the summer drought and will need to be removed either this fall or over the winter. From June 1st to the end of September, we have used 15 million gallons of water this year. For comparison's sake, last year during the same period, we used roughly 7 million gallons of water.

October is a transition month in the turf care center operations. Mowing of tees and fairways gets less frequent and that labor is used to accomplish projects and battle the abundance of leaves that fall on property. The tees, collars, and fairways will receive a last liquid fertilizer application and herbicide and fungicide treatment to prepare it for winter dormancy. The process of seeding rough next to the cart paths and in thin areas of the rough will start soon, a couple loads of sod will be laid in some fairway areas, and leaf cleanup will begin soon. We have a lot of work to do over the next month, and hopefully we will see some much needed precipitation to end one of the driest summers I can remember! The turf care staff has seen its share of adversity this year with weather conditions and staff turnover. I want to give them all a sincere thank you for their hard work and dedication to one another and the Club.
