Once these are installed, we will use the mats for the remainder of the winter to alleviate divots on the bermuda and zoysia grass tees. We are also adding three Turfhound mats at different yardages at the short game area. When the grass is dormant, and we are extremely wet, this will allow members to still use the SGA without having to take divots from the dormant turf.

As we reach the halfway point of fall, we have seen many records regarding the weather that have been broken. The past 60 days have had a new high of 101 degrees (September 21), and new record low of 25 degrees (October 19), and lowest daily dew point of 7 degrees on the same day. The drought also continues, giving us a -6" below normal precipitation summary, and the Mississippi River has set records for lowest water levels. The relative humidity has had to set some records too. There have been several days over the past month when its values have been below 20% and coupled with high winds. This year has for lack of a better term been challenging and I know the irrigation system needs a much needed break!

The management of the turfgrass on the golf course has entered our late fall protocol. The tees, collars, and fairways received their last mowing of the year the third week of September, also a new record for the earliest last mowing. These warm season areas due to the drought and record lows have gone into dormancy. Plant protectants and fertilizer were sprayed on these areas to prevent any fungal activity on the turf before they entered dormancy. We were very liberal with the amount of irrigation applied to these areas as well. The greens are doing very well. The poa contamination at this point is sparse. We have applied our fall growth regulation twice to combat this issue, as we started the applications earlier this fall. The results have been exceptional! These applications create an environment that allows the bentgrass to grow over the stunted poa plants and make the greens pick up speed due to increased density. We have reduced the mowing frequency of the greens, due to limited vertical growth of the bentgrass in response to the regulation applications, photoperiod, and temperatures.

We are now chasing leaves and mulching daily. Over the past couple weeks, the leaves have begun to fall in earnest. November should be filled with blowing and mulching to keep the course playable. Leaf cleanup on the course, when we get serious, requires two turbine blowers, two to three mulching mowers and numerous backpack blowers daily. It is a very time-consuming process. In the coming month, we also intend to shore up some projects with additional dead tree removal, reseeding areas of the rough, refreshing of mulch in some landscape beds, and pruning. Let's hope that mother nature starts to cooperate. I hope you all have a great month and Happy Thanksgiving!
